ORDINANCE NO. 2021-02 BUDGET AND APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE

An Ordinance Establishing the Budget and Appropriations for the Fox River and Countryside Fire/Rescue District for Fiscal Year beginning May 1, 2021 and ending April 30, 2022

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Trustees of the Fox River and Countryside Fire/ Rescue District (the DISTRICT) Kane and DuPage Counties, Illinois, as follows: SECTION 1: That the amount hereinafter set forth, or so much thereof as may be authorized by law, and as may be needed or deemed necessary to defray all expenses and liabilities of the DISTRICT, be and the same are hereby appropriated for the purposes of the DISTRICT, Kane and DuPage Counties, Illinois, as hereafter specified for the fiscal year beginning May 1, 2021 and ending April 30, 2022. SECTION 2: That the following budget containing as estimate of revenues and expenditures is hereby adopted for the following funds: General Fund, Ambulance Fund, Emergency and Rescue Fund, and the Capital Projects/Debt Service Fund.
