



Know what you can and can't burn in unincorporated areas of Kane and DuPage Counties - It varies by zip code!

- Burning of Garbage or Hazardous Material is NEVER permitted
- Burning of dried brush is permitted only on the property upon which it was generated
- Burn on sunny days from 10 am to 3 pm
- Do not burn when wind exceeds 10 mph
- Do not burn within 20 feet of any building, structure, or property line
- ALL burning must be supervised until it is extinguished; Fire Extinguisher; Water Source must be on hand
- Burning of dried brush in fireplaces and self-contained outdoor wood-burning devices is permitted when supervised
- Burning of dried brush for recreational fires is permitted but cannot be larger than 3x3x3
- Ceremonial Fires for a public or private event: Permits must be obtained from the local Fire District and the County Health Department.
- Prairie Restoration permits must be applied for through the local Fire District

Always check with your government website as burning ordinances vary!
